Scout will take 3 hours to complete this challenging first aid meet and clinic. Boy Scouts register for one of the four start times, 9 a.m. 10 a.m. 11 a.m. and Noon. Webelos have a special 1 p.m. start time reserved for them. Each time period is limited to 36 Scouts. Once all available slots are filled, there will be no more. Plan to participate and register NOW!

Boy Scouts will have the opportunity to complete the Eagle required first aid merit badge and Webelos to complete the "first responder" activity. Boy Scouts who plan to earn their First Aid merit badge should bring a blue card signed by their Scoutmaster, have studied the First Aid merit badge book, and come prepared to demonstrate competency at the end of the clinic.

Registration is \$15 per Scout. The registration fee includes the meet and clinic, first aid kit, and event patch. An optional Superheroes First Aid Meet T-Shirt will be available to order for \$10 at registration. There will be a concession operating during the event with food and drinks available to purchase.
