ILST is intended to train youth leaders in your troop on what is required for a leadership position and provide an introduction to essential leadership skills. This workshop is intended to train youth and adult leaders on how to facilitate a successful ILST course. During the workshop, there will be breakout sessions for youth leaders and adult leaders where we will conduct some of the activities and conduct meaningful reflections. The workshop will focus on how to plan an ILST course, where to go to get helpful resources, and how to conduct activities and reflections during the course.</p> <p>Recommended for Troop leaders & youth leadership in the Troop</p>
