**Please note:**

Webelos Adventure activities begin Friday night. You do not have to be present Friday night, but the activities will not be repeated, so you won't earn that Adventure if you come in late.

Webelos Adventrue activities are planned for Sunday morning. You do not have to be present Sunday morning, but you will not earn that Adventure if you leave early.

Cars will only be allowed in camp FRIDAY NIGHT. Vehicles are allowed in camp to drop off gear (one vehicle at a time per site, strictly enforced). You will need to drop gear and return your car to the parking lot. Please respect others waiting to drop gear, by setting up your site **after** you have returned your car to the parking lot. No cars will be permitted to enter camp on Saturday. **There is NO exception to this rule, for safety reasons!**

- 4:45-6:45p.m. Prepare own dinner at campsite.
- 7:00-8:00p.m. Fire bowl - Pack/Den participation encouraged!

- 10p.m. Lights Out. This is quiet time. Please respect your fellow campers.
- 10:15p.m. Trash Pick up

CRITTER ALERT! Make sure all garbage is put out by 10:15 p.m. to be picked up by staff. Do not use program area/shower house garbage cans to dispose of campsite trash. NEVER LEAVE ANY FOOD IN YOUR TENT!

## SAFETY

- Use the buddy system at all times.
- Camp service road and gates will be kept locked after Friday evening, until Sunday departure.**
- Only Camp vehicles will be driven in camp during the event.**
- Pocketknife use must be closely supervised. Scout must have earned whittling card.
- Scout must have adult permission to leave campsite (with a buddy).
- No open flames in or near tents.
- Wear close toed shoes at all times except in tents.
- No running on the trails.
- Fires must be cold to the touch or closely supervised by an adult.
- White fuel is strongly discouraged and can only be handled by an adult.

## WHAT TO BRING - PERSONAL GEAR

- Uniform
- Insect repellent
- Water bottle
- Blanket to sit on for lunch Saturday
- Sleeping bag
- Closed cell foam pad - do not bring air mattress if weather is cold
- Flashlight/ lantern
- Extra socks, underwear, change of clothes
- Toilet paper and toiletries
- Weather appropriate clothing - check the forecast and LAYER. Don't forget rain gear.
- Warm pajamas or sweats. Change all clothes (including underwear) before going to bed in cold weather
- Pillow
- Hat & gloves, warm jacket
- Tent & ground cover
- Towel, washcloth

## WHAT TO BRING - DEN/PACK

- Supplies for all meals except Saturday lunch
- Charcoal
- Stove/fuel for cooking meals
- Den/Pack flags encouraged
- Eating utensils (may be supplied by Packs or individually)
- First aid kit
- Wash station (1 gal. jug with soap)
- Large (yard size) garbage bags

## WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Siblings (space prohibits siblings or guests)
- Pets
- Firearms
- Sheath knives, axes
- Electronic games/radios/etc.
- Fireworks of any kind
- Alcohol (you will be escorted off BSA property)

## REMINDERS & SUGGESTIONS:

- We encourage you to plan and prepare your meals as a Den/Pack group. There is one fire pit per camping area. Camping areas are shared.
- Gear may have to be carried in/out. Pack as lightly as possible and/or bring a wagon. Pack in backpacks to leave hands free to carry additional gear.
- Label all items with name and Pack number in case of loss.
- Carpooling is highly encouraged due to the large number of attendees and limited parking.
- Webelos camping requires one adult per scout, except in the case of siblings. An adult may only sleep in a tent with his or her own son.
- CAMPSITE MUST BE CLEAN BEFORE YOU LEAVE. Remember, a scout Leaves No Trace and leaves a campsite better than he found it.

## DIRECTIONS TO CAMP LAKOTA (2050 Deep Cut Road; Woodstock):

Take Northwest Highway (Rt. 14) through Cary and Crystal Lake. Continue through Woodstock to Deep Cut Road, turn right (watch for the brown "BSA Camp Lakota" sign, just before Deep Cut Rd. Travel approximately 3/4 mile, turn right into Camp Lakota.

Alternatively: Take I-90 west to Rt. 47, turn right. Take Rt. 47 north to Rt. 14, turn left and follow above directions to Deep Cut Rd.

It will take approximately one hour to reach Camp Lakota from any Signal Hill District location.

Landmarks - Camp Lakota is:

- 8.5 miles west of Rt. 47/Farm & Fleet store/Culver's
- 2 miles west of Rt. 120 turnoff

# ACTIVITIES TO PREPARE FOR AS A PACK

- Hauling gear to campsite.
- Skits and songs at the fire bowl Saturday night
- Dens/Packs must provide ALL meals except Saturday lunch. We strongly encourage you to plan and cook your meals as a group (cooking supplies, menus, etc.).
- Carpooling with other members of your Den or Pack will save time and space - parking is limited at Camp Lakota.

### VEHICLES USED IN CAMP

- Only a vehicle towing a trailer will be allowed in camp. All other vehicles will remain in the parking area outside camp. Troop vehicles will be allowed as needed. Gear can be transported to the campsites using a camp vehicle. Each pack may want to bring a wagon. Camp service road and gates will be kept locked after Friday evening, until Sunday departure. Only Camp vehicles will be driven in camp during the event.

### MEALS

- Saturday lunch will be the only meal provided. Webelos Dens/Packs are responsible for all other meals. We also encourage each Den or Pack to make their own cobbler or other snack in their campsite Saturday after the fire bowl activities. This is an enjoyable way to end the day. Be sure to place all leftovers in a garbage bag and place at the road before 10:15p.m.

### WHITE GAS, PROPANE AND FIRES

- Lanterns using white gas fuel are highly discouraged by the BSA. Lanterns using propane canisters are preferable. Adults only must handle all fuel and lanterns.
- Under NO circumstances will OPEN FLAMES OR FIRES be allowed (including lanterns) in tents or screened dining flies.
- Keep a safe distance from campfires. Tents may be no closer than 20 feet from a campfire.
- All campsites MUST have a five gallon bucket of water near campfire (FULL, not empty!).
- Before leaving the campsite or going to sleep, fire must be completely extinguished (cold to the touch), stirred and doused.

### TENTS

- Tents must be at least 20 feet from fire bowls.

### FOOD / GARBAGE

- DO NOT LEAVE ANY FOOD IN YOUR TENT!
- Place all non-burnable items into a garbage bag and place at road before 10:15p.m. each night, Sunday morning, please place garbage in dumpster in the main parking area. If dumpster is full, take the trash home with you.
- Recycling can be placed in the recycling dumpster in the main parking area.

## BUDDY SYSTEM

- When away from the Den site, scouts must be with a designated "buddy" at all times.
- Before leaving the campsite, permission must be granted by an adult leader.

## SAFETY

- Close toed shoes must be worn at all times except in tents.
- Running in camp should only occur when part of a Webelos Unplugged activity. No running on the trails.
- Scouts with a whittling card may bring a pocketknife. They should be closely supervised during any use, and should have their card with them. Staff will confiscate, without warning, any knife being used unsafely.

## QUIET TIME

- Quiet time is 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. PLEASE RESPECT YOUR FELLOW CAMPERS.

## LEAVING CAMP

- Anyone leaving camp must check out at the Program Center. We must have an accurate head count at all times.
- Please make an effort to keep track of how many people are with your unit.

## PACK CHECK OUT

- Your area must be inspected by a staff member before you leave Camp Lakota. Make sure all trash is hauled out and the campsite is ready for the next scout group. Remember, a scout always leaves his campsite better than he found it!
