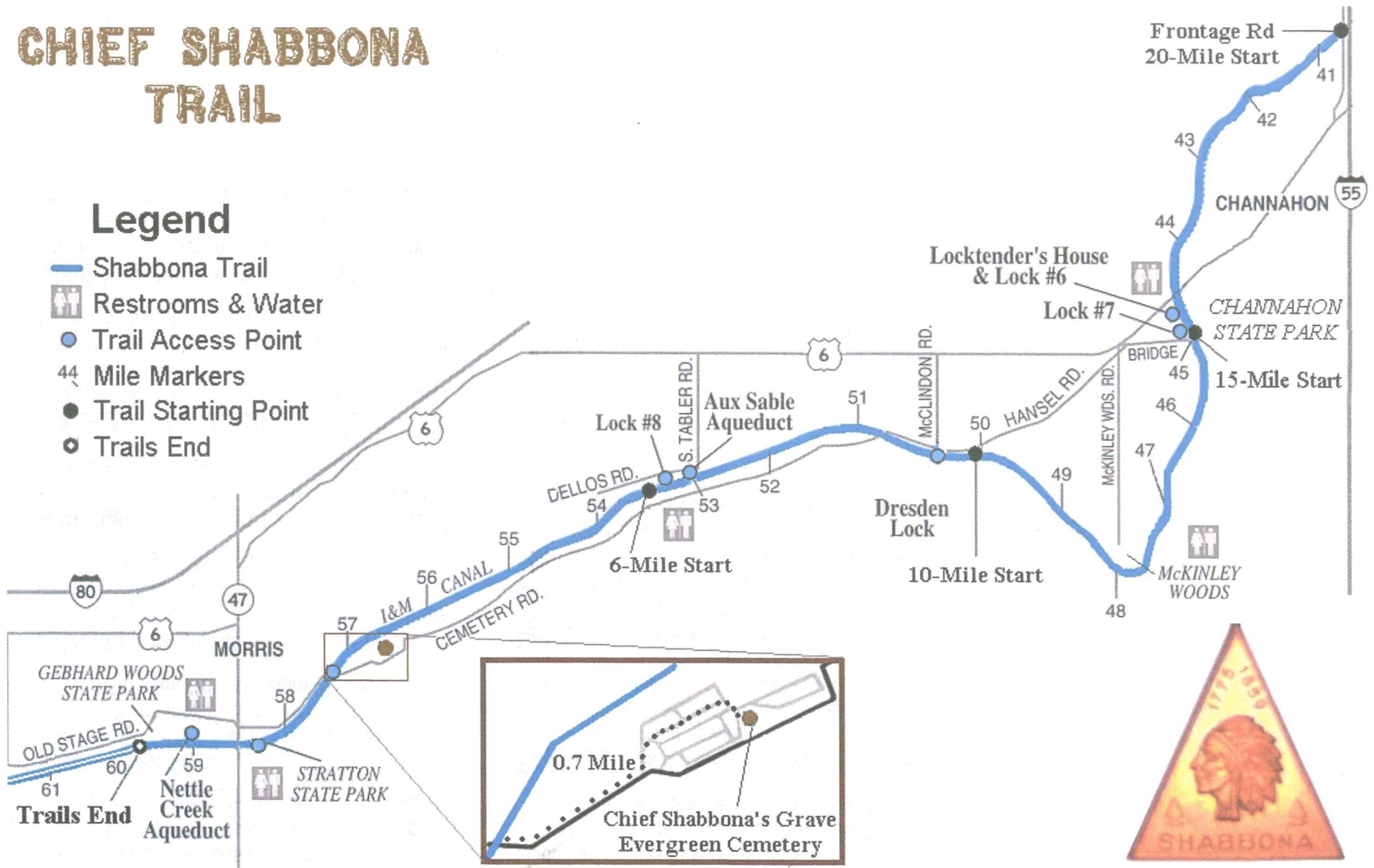


CHIEF SHABBONA TRAIL

Welcome to the Chief Shabbona Trail! Come hike, ride, or cross-country ski from 1 to 20 miles. You can also canoe or kayak from 1 to 15 miles without portage!

The Shabbona Trail is at the heart of the 61-mile Illinois & Michigan Canal National Heritage Corridor. This compacted gravel trail is maintained by the State of Illinois.

Established in the 1950's by Troop 25, the Shabbona Trail features a variety of woodland habitats. Natural sheltering makes the wide trail ideal all four seasons.

I & M Canal Heritage Corridor features 160-year-old locks, buildings, and aqueducts along with the wide variety of trees and plants. This canal was the vital link between the Great Lakes and the Mississippi.

Chief Shabbona walked through these same woods. As an option, you can see his famous gravesite. Shabbona was a true friend to the settlers, constantly helping and protecting them.

Facilities include drinking water, restrooms, picnic tables, and parking lots at: Gebhard Woods, Stratton State Park, Aux Sable Access, McKinley Woods, and Channahon State Park.
