WHAT IS SCOUTING?



Cub Scouts - For ages 5-10, Cub Scouts is a program where youth develop the foundations for leadership, citizenship, and personal fitness through fun activities. Activities include exploring the outdoors, service projects, making friends, and developing a love of learning!



Scouts BSA - For ages 11-17, Scouts BSA is where youth develop outdoor skills, self-confidence, and ethics through youth-planned activities focused in service, community engagement, and leadership. Scouts earn merit badges and work towards Scouting's highest rank, Eagle Scout.

WHY SCOUTING?

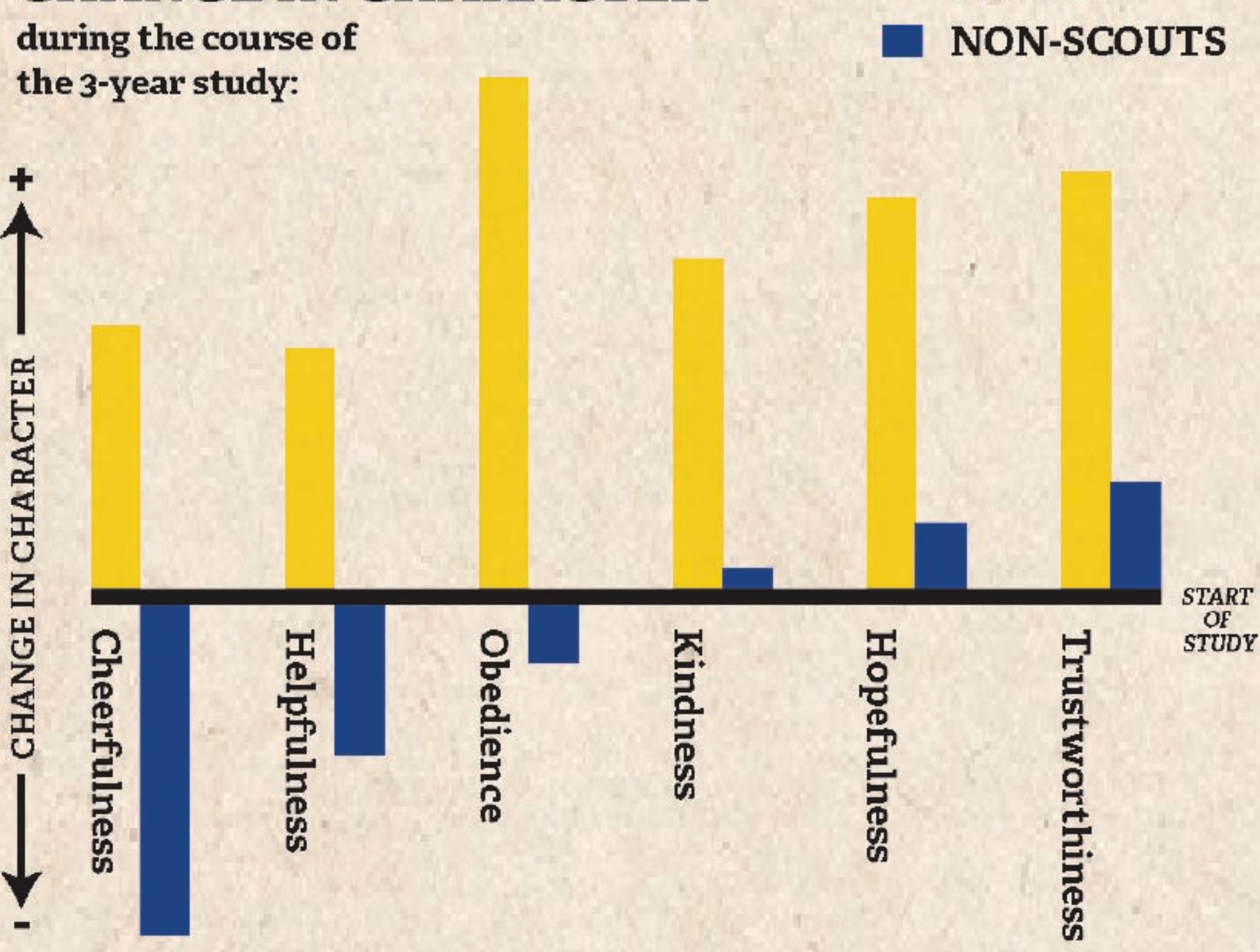
SERVICE - Scouting builds leaders by instilling values of responsibility and service. Former Scouts have gone on to serve on corporate boards, in the White House, and even walk on the moon. The foundation built in Scouting helps members make good decisions throughout life.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT - Scouts practice leadership every day! Learning to listen, be fair, stay organized, delegate, and encourage others. They discover how to accept feedback, work as a team, and most importantly, enjoy the process of leading.

PERSONAL GROWTH - Guided by the slogan Do a Good Turn Daily, Scouts learn to give back without expecting anything in return. These habits build character while teaching responsibility for their communities and the environment.

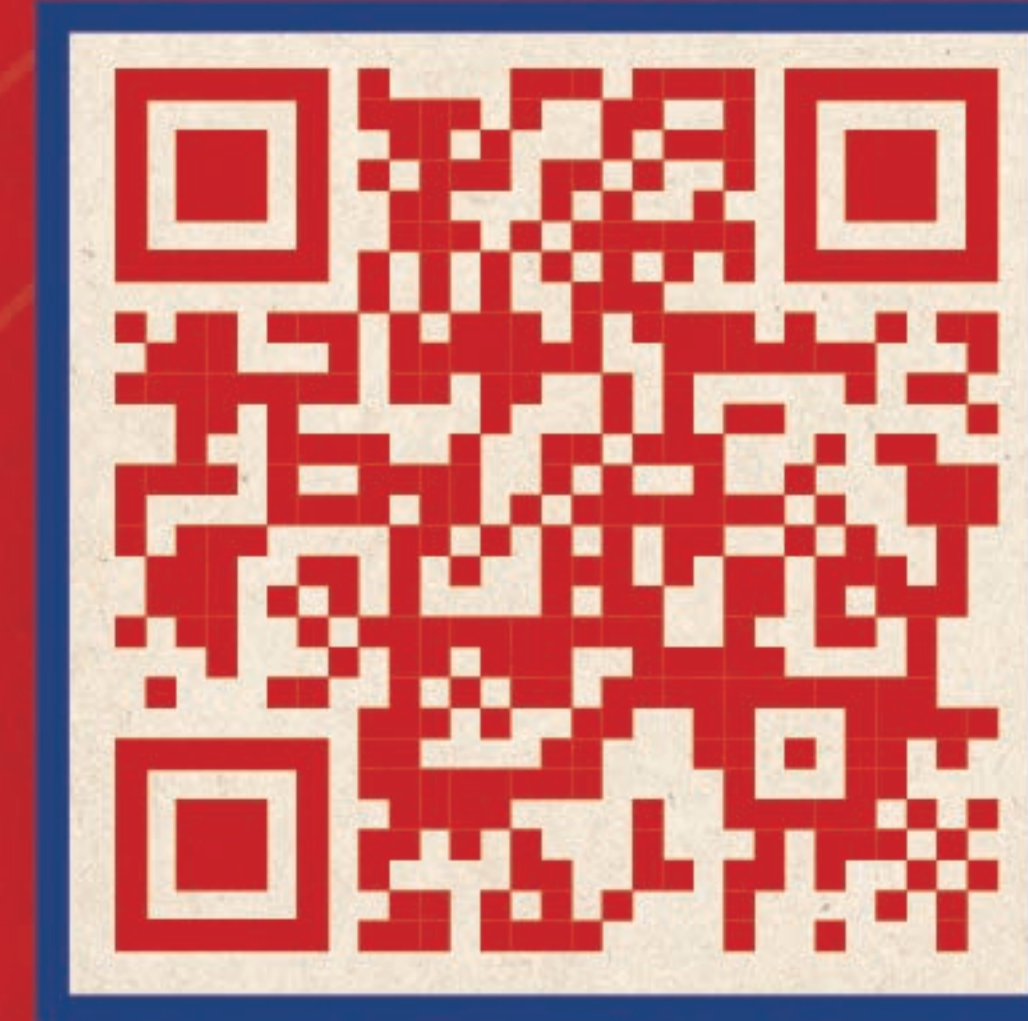
CHANGE IN CHARACTER

Scouting Builds Positive Character - Tufts University worked with Scouting over 3 years to measure character attributes of both Scouts and non-Scouts. In the beginning, there were no significant differences in character attributes. By the end, the differences were striking in several areas.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Scouts join local groups that meet regularly for fun activities, hands-on learning, outdoor adventures, and community events.

Programs are organized by age level so youth can participate in activities designed specifically for their stage and interests. Families can choose the group that best fits their schedule, community, and goals.

Scouting provides opportunities for the whole family to get involved while youth create memories, discover new passions, and grow into confident leaders.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

There is an annual registration and insurance fee to join Scouting. Please contact your local unit for more information.

There are also one-time uniform costs and nominal activity fees that may be charged by your local group.

These costs may be offset by fundraising and financial support for those who qualify.
