It's a jam-packed seven letter word. To some it means resume, to others it means change, to still others it means innovate. To me it means reconnecting. Reconnecting with friends, reconnecting to core values, reconnecting in – Scouting! Whenever I am feeling a bit low on energy, all I need to do is tune into a Scouting meeting or event.

Tonight I reconnected. I tuned into one of our District Chairs meetings. We have 11 Districts led by committed volunteers and coordinated by the indomitable Jim Poueymirou! Between them they lead the 469 units, 14,283 youth and over 5,400 adult volunteers across the 1561 square miles that comprise Pathway. As these numbers attest, all of our indicators are UP! We have resumed what we did so well pre-Covid. And tonight the District Chairs gave me seven fulsome questions to carry to the National Annual Meeting next week in Orlando; questions to which we need answers to help grow Scouting in Pathway.

We are growing and changing. Thanks to our SVP Lou Sandoval, Jackie Ruiz, CEO of JJR Marketing in Naperville, has agreed to serve as Chair of our Marketing Task Force. Jackie will help us figure out how best to get the word out - about needs, opportunities, events and successes. And at the request of attendees at our annual meeting, we will post on our website summary financial information about the Council. Meanwhile, our Commissioner Bertha maintains a highest standard for YPT, and our Membership VP Rick Romani continues to develop new and innovative recruiting programs and metrics for tracking their implementation.

But we still need to innovate more. This newsletter does a fantastic job of notifying about forthcoming events and opportunities to get involved. It would be even better if it shared the good news of all that we are accomplishing – the numbers of Eagle Scouts, Venturing Summits and Sea Scout Quartermasters; the number of Scouts who learned to swim and others who earned Lifesaving Merit Badge; the number of community service hours; and print media coverage and U-Tube postings. We also need a job board to post our need for volunteers. We will work on all of that.

Renewal? You bet! Thanks for all that you have done – and will do – for Pathway Scouting!!

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

What is NYLT? National Youth Leadership Training is an action-packed program designed to provide Scouts with leadership skills and experiences they can use in their home units and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in outdoor troop and patrol settings with an emphasis on immediate application and learning in a fun environment. Scouts are first introduced to interconnecting concepts and work processes. These ideas are then built upon and reinforced using memory aids to allow participants to understand and employ their newfound skills much faster.


Golf Classic

Recruitment Readiness

May Membership Article

Welcome to your May monthly Membership newsletter article. This month's article will talk about Welcoming your new Scouts, especially those AOL Scouts and their families to your Troop and the importance of how Invitation and Application Manager can supplement your unit's recruitment efforts. Is there a key thread between these two topics? This article will correlate how these two topics will support your Spring Recruitment and Peer-to-Peer Recruitment efforts along with your Webelos-to-Scouts Crossovers, which will be further discussed at your May Roundtables.

Welcoming your new Scouts and their families, no matter your unit type, is an important first step to ease concerns when they participate in their first couple of meetings and outings. What you need to remember is that your new Scouts and their families want to fit in and have a sense of belonging. Remember what it was like when you first joined your unit, including moving from a Pack to a Troop? I bet there was plenty of excitement and a bit of confusion too. There is so much going on, including new acronyms, new meeting formats, new responsibilities and so much to learn for both the youth and their families.

There are many great professionals and volunteers involved in Scouting. Did you understand all the roles and responsibilities of the adults involved? How does a new adult determine where they fit in? I know, I did not when I first joined a Troop, as a youth and an adult. That last question is extremely important as units are always looking to recruit adults for positions in their units. Helping new families feel that sense of belonging, at all unit levels, is the primary role of the New Member Coordinator (NMC). A simple welcome can go a long way to improve your unit's Retention of your Scouts and their families. Additional information is located within NMC training at https://pathwaytoadventure.org/membership-resources/#training.

Invitation and Application Managers can be found in "My.scouting" and will support your unit's nline recruitment efforts. Use of these Online Tools all starts with a "current & active" BeAScout Pin. Does your BeAScout Pin contain all your unit's current contact information and meeting location? Why is this important? This will tell a parent the basic information when they do an online search looking for a unit in their neighborhood. An active BeAScout Pin will allow the "Manager" system to generate your unit's "QR Code" that can be used on your recruitment materials. A good example would be adding this QR Code can be added to your Peer-to-Peer recruitment cards.

This QR code will help a parent locate your unit, where they will have two different options. They can either "Request More Information", which generates a Lead in Invitation Manager, or they can "Apply Now" which will generate an Application in Application Manager. Application Manager can also be used to Transfer an existing Scout online to a different unit; an example would be an AOL Scout crossing over to a Troop. The use of either system means that family is recruiting your unit.

In Invitation Manager, a "Lead" means a parent is seeking additional information before they decide to join your unit as they are probably new to Scouting. All Leads should be answered within 72 hours. A Lead not answered and closed due to inactivity is a missed opportunity and tells that family that your unit is not interested in their child joining your unit. Remember, you cannot make a second first impression. If your unit has a New Member Coordinator, this adult can monitor and address these Leads, which can help that family to join your unit.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for all your hard work and dedication to ensure our youth and their families can experience a Quality Scouting program. Please remember, a successful recruitment program, for both youth and adults, should be 24/7 as it can take multiple contacts to recruit a new family to join Scouting. Please read future newsletters, visit our Membership Website, and attend your District Roundtables for additional information. If you have any questions, please work with your District Membership Chair, District Executive, and your Unit Commissioner.
