


Philmont Scout Ranch has been described as the Scout's Disney World. PSR spans across 140,171 acres of northeastern New Mexico. Most of the land was donated by Waite Phillips, successful petroleum business owner for camping, backpacking, and training. Philmont's mountain terrain ranges in elevation from 6621 feet at headquarters to 12,441 feet atop Baldy Mountain.

PSR staff offers a variety of activities including horseback riding, burro packing, mountain bike, gold panning, rock climbing, forestry, riflery, archeology, and much more. Philmont maintains cattle, burros, buffalo, and riding horses.

Philmont Training Center offers a variety of weeklong conferences for volunteers and professionals every summer. While a Scout Leader is in conference, programs are planned for all members of the family—infant to adult. Some of those activities include: Range and Target Activities, High Ropes and Climbing Tower, Fly Fishing, Hiking Trails, Museum Tours (National Scouting Museum, Chase Ranch Tour, Kit Carson Rayado Tour, Villa Philmonte Tour), Pony Rides and Farm Yard, Craft Center, and Horseback Riding.



Recruitment Readiness

August Membership Article

Welcome to your August monthly Membership newsletter article. We hope you are enjoying your summer while preparing for the new school year. Hopefully, your unit has been participating and showing what Scouting has to offer to our youth during festivals and parades in your community or neighborhood. Your unit should now attend your Roundtable Kick-off so you can learn about the new materials that will be available to support your school's open house or back to school event. Please remember that the goal of your summer events was to create the awareness and interest in Scouting so families will want their child to join your unit in the Fall.

Roundtable Kick-off / Fall Recruitment:

This year's recruitment theme is "Adventure is Calling! – We're Ready, Are You?." The purpose of your Roundtable Kick-off is to help your unit prepare for your upcoming Fall Recruitment activities. During your Roundtable Kick-off, you will have the opportunity to address your questions and concerns with your District Membership Chair and obtain the collateral materials to support your recruitment events. Your District Membership Chair will verify with you that your BeAScout Pin is current, handout your Fall Recruitment Collateral Materials, which includes your Leader Recruitment Guide, and gather the dates for your Fall Recruitment events so we can support your needs for success. Your unit's Drive For 5 Goals will be available at your September Roundtable.

This year, there will be flyers, postcards, bookmarks, stickers and gliders with new graphics and our new theme. Other changes include the elimination of the Drawstring Backpacks, Door Hangers, and Catapults. Our new families will receive a Welcome Kit, which will be mailed to their home once their application is processed. Within these Welcome Kits, families will receive a Welcome Letter, their new Recruitment Incentive, how to follow us on Social Media, Scout Shop Discount Coupon, a Council Camporee Ticket, a Bumper Sticker along with Peer-to-Peer information and stickers that can be used to recruit their friends. By attending your Roundtable Kick-off, you can learn more about these new materials and how you can obtain additional materials for your Fall recruitment events.

Please continue to address your online Leads and Applications in a timely manner as we will see an increase in online activity as the new school year begins. For your Leads, please respond to those families within 72 hours and if necessary, follow up with those families within a week if they do not reply to your response. We need to remember, "we cannot make a second first impression." The purpose behind this lead is that families are actually recruiting your unit as their child wants to join Scouting. This is where your New Member Coordinator can help with following up with these families.

Membership Renewal Update:

Please remember that Membership Renewal is an ongoing monthly process. If your unit has any members in their "Lapse Period," your District or Unit Commissioner, District Membership Chair, District Chair and / or your DE will be reaching out to you asking, "How Can We Help." The purpose of this contact is to assist our units to ensure that no Scout or Scouter was inadvertently dropped off your roster. We are working on new Renewal Guides that can help our families and units navigate through this renewal process.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for all your hard work and dedication to ensure our youth, and their families can experience a Quality Scouting program. Please remember, a successful recruitment program, for both youth and adults, should be 24/7 as it can take multiple contacts to recruit a new family to join Scouting. Please read future newsletters, visit our Membership Website, and attend your District Roundtables for additional information. Scouts & NASA

In the Spring of 2014, STEM Scouts from Pathway to Adventure Council, were given the opportunity to participate in a one-of-a-kind experience involving NASA, science, and the International Space Station. What started as 84 possible experiments was narrowed down to a single project, and 24 Scouts and Venturers and their adult mentors began a three-year adventure that culminated in their efforts being delivered to the ISS by a SpaceX resupply mission in August of 2017. Once the payload was delivered to the ISS, the experiment began to run and remained active for the next 28 days before being returned to Earth and the Palatine Scouts. Unfortunately, a missed detail rendered the results unusable.

Norm McFarland, the project lead and Adult Advisor & Mentor from Trailblazer District / Troop 209, was interviewed by Philmont's National Scouting Museum's Program Specialist Harold White to tell us the story of this group of Scouts and their quest to further our knowledge of bacteria and mutation, while at the same time helping these Scouts learn that even when you don't achieve the results you expect it doesn't mean you have failed.
