The World Scout Moot is a world event that brings together young adults from different countries and regions. It promotes inter-cultural exchange, understanding, and friendship. It takes place every four years and is a unique and enriching experience. It's kind of like a jamboree, but it's also so much more.

"Moot was truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience that left a lasting impression on me. Exploring Portugal—from the vibrant streets of Lisbon to the charming towns of Caldas da Rainha and Porto—felt surreal. I spent most of my time in the medieval town of Óbidos, a place rich in history and beauty, known for its ceramics, natural springs, and iconic castle. Everyday was a different adventure in a different place. The atmosphere was magical, and every corner held something new to discover.

What made the experience even more unforgettable were the people I met along the way. Their kindness and warmth made me feel instantly connected, and I carry their presence with me wherever I go. I still find myself talking about them every chance I get. Moot wasn't just my first international event—it was the spark that ignited a deeper passion for global connection, cultural exchange, and personal growth."

Recruitment Readiness

September Membership Article

Welcome to your September monthly Membership newsletter article. As you read this month's Membership article, we know you have been busy preparing for the new school year. During the month of September, your unit should be in execution mode with your recruitment plan. Hopefully, your unit was able to attend and participate in your August Roundtable Kick-off and learn more about this year's recruitment theme "Adventure is Calling! — We're Ready, Are You?." along with the materials and tools available for your use. If your unit was unable to attend your August Roundtable Kick-off, or have any questions, please work with your District Membership Chair or District Executive to obtain the supplies you need to support your recruitment event.

During the next couple of months, your unit's plan should include hosting a table at your school's open house along with events in your communities and neighborhoods this Fall. All your recruitment events should be advertised by using the multiple tools available, which could include Flyers, Yard Signs, Geo-Fencing, and Customized Videos, to name a few. Another successful form of recruitment is Peer-to-Peer Recruitment, which has a youth recruiting a youth and / or a parent recruiting a parent. All recruitment materials and tools can be found on our PTAC Membership website (https://pathwaytoadventure.org/unit-resources/recruitment-materials/).

Again, this year, we offer multiple incentives for our new and existing youth, along with our Packs. The Pack incentive, "Drive For 5", is when a unit Recruits 5 new Scouts over their 3-Yr Rolling Average, has a Registered & Trained New Member Coordinator, holds a Recruitment Event + provide your recruitment date to your District Membership Chair & DE and all new Scouts complete their Bobcat requirements within 60 days. Meet these incentives and our Pack receives Pinewood Derby Cars for all Scouts in the Pack! All new Scouts recruited throughout the year will be included in your Pack's 2024 Drive For 5 Incentive, which runs through December 15th. Starting in early September, all new families who join will receive a Welcome Kit from Council by the end of the month they have joined. This includes those families who joined in July and August.

For our Packs and Troops, we offer Peer-to-Peer incentives (one per youth) for those existing Scouts who recruit a new Scout. In a Troop, a new Scout cannot be a Cub Scout who crosses over to a Troop. For Cub Scouts, a Scout in Kindergarten – 2nd Grade can receive Sunglasses, while those Scouts in 3rd – 5th Grade can either receive an Engraved Pocket Knife or Sunglasses. For Scouts BSA, an existing Scout can receive either an Engraved Pocket Knife or a Gift Certificate to the Scout Shop. Please see your Membership Recruitment Guide for additional details behind these incentives (https://pathwaytoadventure.org/unit-resources/recruitment-materials/).

Please continue to address your online Leads and Applications in a timely manner as we will see an increase in online activity as the new school year begins. For your Leads, please respond to those families within 48 to 72 hours and if necessary, follow up with those families within a week if they do not reply to your response. We need to remember, "we cannot make a second first impression." The purpose behind this lead is that families are actually recruiting your unit as their child wants to join Scouting. This is where your New Member Coordinator can help with following up with these families.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for all your hard work and dedication to ensure our youth, and their families can experience a Quality Scouting program. Please remember, a successful recruitment program, for both youth and adults, should be 24/7 as it can take multiple contacts to recruit a new family to join Scouting. Please read future newsletters, visit our Membership Website, and attend your District Roundtables for additional information. If you have any questions, please work with your District Membership Chair, District Executive, and your Unit Commissioner.





Japan Scouts Visit PTAC

20 Years of Friendship: Japanese Scouts Visit Owasippe & Chicago

August 2025 — PTAC recently welcomed Scouts from Japan for a two-week cultural exchange blending classic Scouting with big-city adventure, celebrating two decades of friendship.

The visiting Scouts, ages 14–18, began at Owasippe Scout Reservation, camping alongside PTAC Scouts for a week. They enjoyed swimming, archery, hiking, campfires, and merit badge activities, while sharing Japanese Scouting customs, songs, and games.

Next, they spent three days in downtown Chicago, staying at Roosevelt University and visiting Millennium Park, the Art Institute, and the Chicago Riverwalk. They also explored Indiana Dunes National Park, hiking with a park volunteer and relaxing at the beach—complete with photos laughing with Lake Michigan lifeguards.

City highlights included:

- A Chicago Cubs game at Wrigley Field, with a special onfield photo
- Sailing on Lake Michigan with Sea Scouts Ship 5111, learning navigation skills
- Sampling Chicago hot dogs & deep-dish pizza while riding the CTA

Scouts from both countries shared meals, stories, and laughs, strengthening global bonds. "This wasn't just a trip. It was the continuation of a relationship that started over 20 years ago," said a PTAC leader.

PTAC and its partners will continue this tradition, alternating between hosting in the U.S. and visiting Japan, promoting leadership, understanding, and lifelong friendships.


