Camp Betz Needs Camp Masters!

The Camp Betz Camp Master Corps is a group of adult volunteers that oversee the use of Camp Betz, and we are looking for more volunteers.

The purpose of a Camp Master is to reach out to units before their weekend, check their arrival time and prepare them with necessary pre-arrival information. On Friday, the Camp Master opens camp and gets ready to greet them. Camp Masters assist units when needed, making sure all facilities are in working order, like lights, furnaces, and bathrooms. They check units out on Sunday and secure the camp before leaving. They also supply coverage during our training programs throughout the year, like Wood Badge, NYLT, OKPIK and Family Camp. The Camp Master is the first line of security for the camp and campers. This means you are the eyes and ears of the camp, on the lookout for any potential problems. Once all units are checked in, you are more or less "on call" - free to relax in Anderson Lodge or enjoy the beauty of Camp Betz until/unless a unit needs assistance.

Camp Masters should be available to be at camp on Friday before campers arrive – usually around 3 pm. As the last person to leave on Sunday, they should expect to stay until at least noon.

We encourage Camp Masters to volunteer for at least a few weekends a year. Online training is available that explains all the duties and procedures, and an experienced fellow Camp Master will show you the ropes when your first weekend comes.

Recruitment Readiness

October Membership Article

Welcome to your October monthly Membership newsletter article. As you read this month's Membership article, we know you are busy kicking off the 2025 / 2026 Scouting Season in your unit. This article touches on 3 topics, Welcoming and Acclimating your new Scouts and their families to your unit, Working your Online Leads and Applications along with monthly Membership Renewal. While these 3 topics support both Recruiting and Retention, there is another theme associated with these topics which is "Leave No Scout or Families Behind". Having a registered and trained New Member Coordinator (NMC) in your unit plays a key role in all 3 of these topics.

Parents want their children to have fun, but that might not be their primary consideration. When talking with your parents, please "actively listen" to hear their concerns. Each parent could have a slightly different concern, but everyone's main concern will be "Fitting In" within your unit. What are the typical questions or concerns a new family might have when joining a Pack, Troop, Crew or Ship, especially if the parents didn't grow-up in Scouting? These questions and concerns can also exist if you have Scouts and their families who cross over from a Pack to a Troop, or transfer from another unit, as this is a whole new experience. Please take a moment to reflect on what it was like for you and your family when you first joined your unit. This reflection can help you better understand and address those questions and concerns of your new Scouts and their families.

One reason why your new families might want to leave your unit could be related to a Lack of Communication, especially if nobody ever called or emailed after an online application or lead, or a Lack of Onboarding information. Please remember, parents want organized, purposeful activities with trained leaders as they believe this will enhance their child's life. New members, both youth and adult want to "Fit In" and have a sense of belonging. These first few weeks in the unit can make the difference between staying or leaving. This approach can lead to increased retention of your youth and adults, along with parental involvement, which can help your unit grow.

Next month, your Membership article will focus on why a new or existing Scout, and their family joined your unit and why they might leave. Understand this "WHY", will better help your unit retain your Scouts and their families as they want to be "Seen, Heard and Included".

Please remember that Membership Renewal is an ongoing monthly process throughout the entire year. If your unit has any members in their "Lapse Period," your District or Unit Commissioner, District Membership Chair, District Chair and / or your DE will be reaching out to you asking, "How Can We Help." The purpose of this contact is to assist our units to ensure that no Scout or Scouter was inadvertently dropped off your roster.

Please continue to address your online Leads and Applications in a timely manner as we will see an increase in online activity as the new school year begins. For your Leads, please respond to those families within 48 to 72 hours and if necessary, follow up with those families within a week, whether with a phone call or email, if they do not reply to your response. We need to remember, "we cannot make a second first impression." The purpose behind this lead is that families are actually recruiting your unit as their child wants to join Scouting. This is where your New Member Coordinator can help with following up with these families.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for all your hard work and dedication to ensure our youth, and their families can experience a Quality Scouting program. Please remember, a successful recruitment and retention program, for both youth and adults, should be 24/7 as we need to keep in contact with all our families, new and existing, throughout the entire year. Please read future newsletters, visit our Membership Website, and attend your District Roundtables for additional information. 
